It's official! Food 4 All Cbus opened it first community fridge in front of the RIC office, and it is up and running!

Saturday, December 16, RIC staff, Food 4 All Cbus volunteers and neighbors came together in a beautiful display of generosity and support. We were so excited by the turnout of donors, volunteers, and community members who joined us for the ribbon cutting.

We saw neighbors meeting new neighbors, sharing stories, and leaving with groceries in hand. Kids enjoyed hot cocoa and delicious treats as they learned about the fridge.

What is a community fridge? A place for neighbors to give food, and to receive food, at will, as needed, no questions asked.

Why? Every one deserves access to food. And there is no one size fits all way to address the food scarcity issues that plague our city.

**How does it work?** The fridge is unlocked and open 24/7. Anyone can drop off food and anyone can take the food. *We are asking for all meat donations to be halal.* If you bring a dish you prepared or fresh leftover, mark it clearly with the date and ingredients. **Detailed rules can be found here**

We are extraordinarily grateful to our friends at Community Refugee and Immigration Services (CRIS) for allowing us to work in their office during this time. Without them, there wouldn't have been ANY services for those weeks of construction!
