Annissa's Story of Belonging & Giving Back



Annissa, her husband and 4 children arrived in Columbus from Algeria in June of 2023. One of the first things her family did was go to the RIC for school enrollment and job help. Annissa attend two fun RIC events, including our Community Festival and a group outing to the John Beltz Farm, hosted by RIC and "Love the City."

Now, she is a part of the Monday night Women's Empowerment group, hosted by our staff member Hamida. Annissa told us that she especially appreciates this group for the friendships she has made. She has received valuable guidance on her rights as an immigrant, for example, how insurance works, and how to interact with the schools her children attend. She even learned about self-care and is starting to 'give back' by supporting other women who come to her with stressful situations.

Annissa told us the story of one woman who came to the empowerment group one night, crying. This woman's landlord did not rent her the apartment she was initially promised, but exchanged it for one less desirable. Annissa was able to share her own apartment woes with the crying woman, and then Hamida helped contact the rental company to resolve the situation. Annissa is so appreciative of the RIC and her friends in the empowerment group. In her own words,

"Thank you for everything"

Currently, Annissa is working part time as a babysitter for other working mothers on Riverview Drive and was recently hired part time at the Marriott as a Lobby Attendant. We are proud of where Annissa has come from and where she is going!

RIC Partnership Spotlight: Our Helpers

Our partnership with the local nonprofit *Our Helpers* began in spring 2023, when we collaborated to help more than 40 Riverview neighbors receive emergency rent assistance, provided by the City of Columbus.

Because that collaboration was so successful, Our Helpers' Director, Dr. Dorothy Hassan, reached out again in late 2023 to offer to provide new, high-quality English classes to our neighbors. Our Helpers had grant funding to offer this programming and were looking for a site to host and support the enrolling students. In January of this year, we launched weekend English as a Second Language classes for women. Our classroom was full with 12 students attending the first session!

Beginning in April, we will offer mixed classes for men and women four days per week! These unique classes focus on English for employment and advancement, and include materials and access to a learning app that students can use to practice at home. One staff member went downstairs to check on the new class and commented, "It's like a college class, everyone was quiet [and paying attention]. The students were so happy!"

Hamida recounts, "I called her and said, *Why didn't you come to the women's group today*? The woman laughed and said, *I was at the hospital having my baby boy!*"
