I did not know the neighbors that well at first and I felt nervous, but they were really welcoming and engaging with me; that made me happy. The thing that surprised me is how much the neighbors trust the RIC staff. I can tell that the staff don't treat their job as just a job, because I can see how much the neighbors love them and trust them. It is not easy to gain that kind of trust, but the staff has earned it by always trying to learn about their neighbors, so they can give them the best service.
