Both Nouara and Lamia were earlier recipients of RIC help when they arrived in 2019 and now were calling for the same family! Em and I both had meetings with this new family, who were temporarily living with Nouara and getting rides to our office from Lamia! The husband started working right away, and his wife got Medicaid and is getting prenatal care now. When they moved into their own apartment, I asked what baby items they needed, and was pleased to learn that the Algerian Amazigh (what is Amazigh?) community on Riverview had already given them nearly everything! As much as we love to support our neighbors and new families, we love it even more when we see our community supporting each other!

The weather is getting warmer and the days are growing longer. Flowers are blooming, trees are green again, and it feels like the pandemic situation is finally starting to improve!
