Mid-Ohio Farm at NBC4 groundbreaking with the RIC!



This has been a long time coming - a dream suggested by original RIC board president, Bruce Bernard, owner of the RIC apartment office space and major funder to start the RIC. Bruce noticed the fallow land bordering Riverview Drive and saw possibilities for gardening, green space and walkways. He met annually with Ken Freedman, general manager of NBC4, to discuss his vision. On June 14, this vision became a reality as major stakeholders in the **Mid-Ohio Farm at NBC4**. gathered for the official groundbreaking. Bruce was not able to attend but Ken acknowledged Bruce's dream.

Excerpt from NBC4 news:

COLUMBUS, Ohio (WCMH) — The Mid-Ohio Food Collective and NBC4 announced a joint venture urban farm to grow up to 100,000 pounds of food annually. Imagine being able to grow 5 Acres of food on 1/8 of an acre of land! Thats what will hppen when a fallow 2.7 acres behind NBC4 is converted into the **Mid-Ohio Farm at NBC4**. The venue will employ high-tech vertical hydroponics practices and grow dozens of plants per square foot vertically, as opposed to one plant per square foot like a traditional horizontal farm or garden.



Along Riverview Drive adjacent to the NBC4 studios, there are approximately 2,500 people who have moved from other parts of the world. Most are new Americans who are immigrants and asylum seekers, while others are international students who attend Ohio State University.

According to Diane Linton, the interim executive director of Riverview International Center, many residents simply want fresh veggies.

"They grow food in five gallon buckets along the fence line that separates the parking lots of the multiple family unit apartments from NBC4's parking lot." Linton said. "This is very exciting that this is going in because there are so many possibilities," Linton said. "There is something new on our street to involve people in a different way".

The neighborhood is a food desert. An apartment complex replaced the grocery store that used to be within walking distance. The larger neighborhood consists of numerous restaurants and hotels.
