In many ways, the RIC has become a kind of facilitator in an effort to promote neighbors helping neighbors. Our goal is to take advantage of and share the many and varied skills of our neighbors. The story of Salsabil and Ghaniya is an example of this cooperative spirit. Salsabil came to the RIC often for help acquiring her Master's of French US equivalency in order to aid her job search with our RIC career specialists. Another neighbor, Ghaniya, a mother of many small children, was also coming to the RIC, looking for employment. Both women experienced a variety of barriers, including a lack of transportation, childcare, and one, English proficiency. These two ladies met and decided to work together to make their goals happen! They both were hired by a local charter school, as substitute teachers and housekeepers, respectively. Their husbands are now sharing transportation carpooling roles to get the women to and from the school. In addition, a third neighbor is helping with their childcare needs so the women can work! This is the kind of thing that makes this community unique, special, and necessary—empowering each other is contagious!

Did you know? **Holy month for Muslims and Christians**

This year, two very important holy seasons for many Muslims and Christians, Ramadan and Lent, respectively, overlap in the month of March. Both holy seasons are a time of fasting. The dates of Ramadan are determined by the moon and 30 days of fasting from food and drink during the day, with fasts broken every evening during a celebratory meal and prayer time called iftar. Lent, on the other hand, is 40 days of fasting from general indulgences like meat, chocolate, coffee, etc. Ramadan ends with a celebtration called Eid and Lent ends with the celebration of Easter.
